

Queensland Grabs Lead In Fifth Inning To Defeat New South Wales Country

Queensland took the lead late in the game in a 6-4 victory over New South Wales Country on Friday. The game was tied at two with Queensland batting in the bottom of the fifth when Lachlan Jones singled on a 1-1 count, scoring one run.

Queensland collected five hits on the day. Tyler Wise and Jones each racked up multiple hits for Queensland. Jones and Wise each managed two hits to lead Queensland. New South Wales Country totalled six hits in the game. Hamish Weekes and Vella all managed multiple hits for New South Wales Country.
